FROM THE PASTOR

Dear Friends in Christ,

During the past week, the Church throughout the world mourned the passing of Pope Emeritus Benedict XVI, who was laid to rest on Thursday. Our parish offered Mass for the repose of his soul on Tuesday evening; it was moving to see a large number of parishioners in attendance. The Mass was made more beautiful by the participation of parish musicians and several altar servers. Thirteen years ago, reflecting on today's feast of the Epiphany, Benedict XVI offered a reflection that speaks also to our experience of mourning his passing while simultaneously rejoicing that he lived and died with the hope of eternal life:

"...it is precisely with the resurrection of the dead that he became 'preeminent in all things' (Col 1: 18). Jesus himself affirms this, appearing to his disciples after the Resurrection: 'all authority in Heaven and on earth has been given to me' (Mt 28: 18). This awareness supports the way of the Church, Body of Christ, on the paths of history. There is no shadow, however dark, that can obscure Christ's light."

The readings of Epiphany remind us that we too do not walk in the darkness, but in the light of the Lord who was born for us and, through His Church, has been manifested to the whole world. As the disciples of Jesus, it is our task to be the light of the Star of Bethlehem for the men and women of this age who still do not know the Lord but are seeking Him whenever they seek the truth with a sincere heart.

using funds in your retirement account to support your parish. The **IRA Charitable Rollover** allows donors who are 70.5 years or older to transfer up to \$100,000 from a traditional or Roth IRA to a qualified charity like The Catholic Foundation. In doing so, donors keep their IRA distribution from impacting their gross income and possibly avoid being bumped into a higher tax bracket. The IRA charitable rollover can also count toward your required minimum distribution (RMD), which starts at age 72.

All transfers must be made directly from an IRA custodian to The Catholic Foundation by December 15th to qualify as a 2022 rollover and be excluded from the donor's taxable income.
