FROM THE PASTOR

Dear Friends in Christ,

Time marches on and we are just three months away from the end of 2022. As a parish we often have to look rather far ahead to set up new activities and programs, so I'd like to call your attention to the notice in this bulletin about a new initiative that will get underway in February, 2023: What We Believe. This program will bring out the beauty and truth of our Catholic faith. In addition to participating yourself, you might want to invite a friend or two.

This Friday in the Church calendar is the memorial of Our Lady of the Rosary. Pope Pius V established this feast to give thanks for a naval victory over the Turks at the battle of Lepanto in the year 1570. This victory, won by a coalition of forces from Christian countries, stopped the expansion of Islam into Europe. Because the entire month of October is dedicated to the Rosary, it is good to remember the necessity for Christians to unite in prayer if we are to win the victory against the enemies of the Faith in our own time. I especially hope that our parish families will share the custom of a family rosary with their own children at home. Very small children will find the Rosary a rather long prayer, and their attention will wander, but they can still participate according to their own abilities, while the older children can help lead the prayers.

During the past week, once again, I got to travel to Columbus to meet with a committee of priests revising the bylaws of the Presbyteral Council. Someone asked me to say more about what that group is and what it does. Here is a summary:

A presbyteral council or council of priests is a group of priests chosen to assist the local bishop in an advisory capacity in the governance of a Roman Catholic diocese. Canon 495 of the Code of Canon Law lays down that every diocese must have such a council. The council addresses matters concerning the pastoral welfare of the people of God in the local church. About half of the members of the council are freely elected by the priests. The others have membership either because of a position that they hold (ex officio) or because nominated by the bishop.
