FROM THE PASTOR

Dear Friends in Christ,

Do you know when Christmas is? This year, I mean. Recently I was talking to some Catholics who live in the Columbus area and mentioned that Christmas falls on a Sunday this year. They responded, "Does it? I haven't looked that far ahead." Well, I have, and it does. Looking ahead, I can see a lot of other things happening that will keep the priests and parishioners rather active in the time between now and the end of the calendar year. Advent begins on the last Sunday of November. On every Sunday during Advent, we will sing Vespers in the church at 5 p.m., followed by confessions. December 8, a Thursday, is the Solemnity of the Immaculate Conception. On Sunday, December 11, Bishop Fernandes will come to our parish to preside at Vespers. Also, Christmas falls on a Sunday this year.

Following the death of Queen Elizabeth II, the media are running a lots of stories about her descendants and their various royal titles, some of which may be subject to change soon. The Psalm at today's Mass shifts our attention away from such exalted personages with the stark refrain, "The LORD hears the cry of the poor." In 2011, Pope Benedict XVI visited Benin, where he offered some timely reflections on kingship and poverty: Commenting on how the Son of God humbled Himself to become one of us, he said, "Today, like two thousand years ago, accustomed to seeing the signs of royalty in success, power, money and ability, we find it hard to accept such a king, a king who makes himself the servant of the little ones, of the most humble, a king whose throne is a cross. And yet, the Scriptures tell us, in this is the glory of Christ revealed; it is in the humility of his earthly existence that he finds his power to judge the world. For him, to reign is to serve! And what he asks of us is to follow him along the way, to serve, to be attentive to the cry of the poor, the weak, the outcast."

CATHOLIC MEN'S LUNCHEON CLUB – FRIDAY NOVEMBER 4, 2022. Major General Edward J. Mechenbier, USAF Retired will speak about his experience as a prisoner of war during the Vietnam War in a talk entitled "A Funny Thing Happened on the Way to Vietnamese Prison." Please join us Friday, November 4 at St. Patrick Church in downtown Columbus for lunch and General Mechenbier's talk. In June 1967, General Mechenbier was shot down on his 113th combat mission, his 80th over North Vietnam. He was a Prisoner of War for nearly six years. On his return to the United States, he was awarded the Silver Star with the first Oak Leaf Cluster for his resistance to demands by the North Vietnamese for information, confessions, and propaganda material. He also received a Bronze Star with "V" device for his efforts to conduct himself strictly in accordance with the Code of Conduct while POW. The November luncheon is sponsored by Catholic Cemeteries in the Columbus diocese. More information about Catholic cemeteries is available at <https://columbuscatholic.org/cemeteries>. Holy Mass (optional) begins at 11:45 a.m. followed by lunch at 12:10 p.m. and General Mechenbier's talk.
