Dear Friends in Christ,

Last Sunday evening, our church hosted a beautiful celebration of Vespers, presided over by Bishop Fernandes, who was making his first visit to our parish. Six boys from the parish served! The music was beautiful and prayerful. The HOST Guild put together a lovely reception afterwards at which everyone had a chance to meet the bishop. Please join us this Sunday at 5 p.m. for the final celebration of Advent Vespers. Confessions will be heard after Vespers.

The Scriptures this Sunday focus our attention on the Baby to be born at Christmas, under the name "Emmanuel -- God-with-us." Pope Francis draws out the value of this name for us, observing that it tells us that Jesus is not just an idea or an ideology. "He is God-with-us, who witnessed to the love of the Father by sharing our human condition to the full". This suggests that we, the disciples of Jesus, can show the love of the Father to others in a similar way: not by offering ideas, or striving to show that we are right and the other person is wrong, but by sharing their hardships and joys.

REAP THE MOST TAX BENEFIT WHILE SUPPORTING YOUR PARISH

Maximize your giving dollars before the ball drops on New Year's Eve by

using funds in your retirement account to support your parish. The **IRA Charitable Rollover** allows donors who are 70.5 years or older to transfer up to \$100,000 from a traditional or Roth IRA to a qualified charity like The Catholic Foundation. In doing so, donors keep their IRA distribution from impacting their gross income and possibly avoid being bumped into a higher tax bracket. The IRA charitable rollover can also count toward your required minimum distribution (RMD), which starts at age 72. All transfers must be made directly from an IRA custodian to The Catholic Foundation by December 15th to qualify as a 2022 rollover and be excluded from the donor's taxable income. INTRODUCING THE EMMAUS ROAD SCHOLARSHIP FUND:

The Diocese of Columbus Office of Catholic Schools recently launched the Emmaus Road Scholarship Fund, a scholarship granting organization (SGO) of the Diocese of Columbus that was formed to capitalize on a new tax credit passed into law by the Ohio Legislature in late 2021. As dictated by Ohio law, the funds raised by the SGO are to be used primarily for academic scholarships for students to attend K-12 schools and prioritized for lowincome families. However, ALL students in Our Catholic Schools have the potential to benefit from these scholarship funds. How does it work? Donors who make a gift to the Emmaus Road Scholarship Fund receive a dollarfor-dollar credit (not a deduction) on their Ohio income tax liability - up to \$750 per person, or \$1,500 if married filing jointly - effectively allowing them to make a choice about how their Ohio tax dollars are utilized. Donors can restrict their gift for the benefit of one or more schools of their choosing, or they may direct their dollars to the unrestricted fund which helps the greatest number of students in the diocese. The Emmaus Road Scholarship Fund creates much-needed scholarship dollars for Our Catholic Schools while giving donors the power to put their tax dollars to work to support Catholic education.
