FROM THE PASTOR

Dear Friends in Christ,

Today's Gospel reading is one of the most famous passages in all the Gospels: the beatitudes. The beatitudes are a series of statements beginning with the word "blessed" or "happy" – in Latin, *beati*. In reading the beatitudes we need to lay aside all our assumptions about what it means to be "blessed" or "happy" and enter into the way of thinking of the people of Jesus' time. For them, the source of every blessing was God. The meaning of this becomes clear when Jesus follows a series of statements beginning "blessed are you" another series beginning "woe to you." The blessed are those who believe that God is going to give them something in the future; the cursed are those who pay attention only to what they or other human beings can do for them right now.

The Beatitudes, in the words of Pope Benedict XVI, call us "to free oneself from the false values of the world and to open oneself to the true goods, present and future." While all Christians need to let the Beatitudes speak to them, I suggest that Christians who are raising children pay especial attention to these words of Jesus. Parents have a difficult task, because they must constantly ask their children to think about the future, while children tend to live in the present moment. We can bring up children in the way of discipleship by teaching them that the rewards that really matter come only in the future, and that not all present hardship is evil. Actually, that is a good thing for all of us to keep in mind, no matter how old we may be.

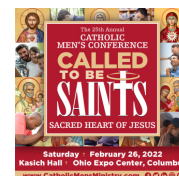
