FROM THE PASTOR

Dear Friends in Christ,

We're hoping to see everyone at the parish fish fry this Friday. Please come to support this fun activity, proceeds from which help to feed the hungry in our area.

During Lent, our attention is naturally drawn to the sufferings of Our Lord Jesus Christ, through participation in such exercises as the Stations of the Cross, and the liturgies of Palm Sunday and Good Friday. This year, St. Mary Church in Marion will also be hosting a traveling exhibit that offers another way to contemplate and learn from Our Lord>s passion: The Man of the Shroud.

The Shroud of Turin has long been venerated by the faithful, and is believed by many to be the burial cloth of Jesus of Nazareth. The Shroud is one of the most scientifically studied religious icons in history. As science has progressed, so has the speculation on how the image of the crucified man of the Shroud was made.

The exhibit presents the results of a comprehensive scientific, historical and forensic study with numerous photographs and illustrations. The exhibit is the work of The Center for the Study of the Passion of Christ and the Holy Shroud, Monsignor Giulio Ricci and other scientists, who spent more than 25 years researching the Holy Shroud.

The centerpiece of the exhibit is a full-length replica of the Shroud developed from a photographic image of the Shroud made by the Eastman Kodak Co. The replica shows the front and back of the shroud. In addition, the mobile exhibit contains a large crucified corpus showing the wounds of Christ corresponding to the passion narrative in the Gospel accounts and the wounds shown on the Shroud. The exhibit contains 66 panels detailing the history and science of the Shroud.

These items will be on display in the gymnasium of Saint Mary School in Marion the following days and times:
