FROM THE PASTOR

Dear Friends in Christ,

After the many and varied liturgical experiences of Holy Week, this week has seemed rather quiet in contrast. This was the first somewhat normal Holy Week experience we have been able to have since 2019, and it was a joy to see so many turn out for the liturgies on Thursday, Friday, and Saturday night. We are grateful to everyone who worked extra hard to make these liturgies beautiful and solemn, including those who decorated the church, the cleaners, musicians, servers, ushers, lectors, sacristans, and office personnel.

The first reading of today's Mass emphasizes the growth of the Church, noting that many "were added to the Lord." That's an interesting phrasing, isn't it? It does not say, "many joined the community" or "many people started to believe in God." When someone joins the Church, God is adding them to something that already exists: his own holy people. The scripture does not say, however, that "many were added to the Church" but "many were added to the Lord." The New Testament does not draw a sharp distinction between the risen Lord Jesus and his Body, the Church.

Your input is critical in order for the planning committee to assess the viability of the draft model and, if necessary, to determine a more reasonable alternative.
