### FROM THE PASTOR

Dear Friends in Christ,

This weekend we see a kind of collision between the calendar of the Church and the civil calendar. As Catholics, we are celebrating the Ascension of the Lord, while all Americans, of any or no religions, are preparing to observe Memorial Day on Monday. The history and present practices of Memorial Day might help us appreciate the mystery of Christ's Ascension in a new way. Memorial Day was originally called "Decoration Day." It was a day to go to

the cemeteries to decorate the graves of veterans, especially those who died in the Civil War. In the North, May 30 was proposed as a suitable date, in part because it was not the anniversary of any major battle of the Civil War. After the United States participated in the First World War, the holiday became an occasion to honor all veterans. Beginning in 1971, it has been observed as a federal holiday on the last Monday in May.

When you visit a cemetery on Memorial Day, it is stirring to see flags placed by all the veteran's graves. We are reminded especially of those who gave their lives in a just cause, to end slavery, to make the world safe for democracy, to put an end to racist dictatorships, to stop the spread of communism, to limit terrorism. At the same time, we know that war is always a sign that human beings have failed to build up and maintain a civilization of love, based on respect for the human dignity of all. Those who died for a just cause in war need to be honored, and we do not disrespect their sacrifice by observing that the world is still a dangerous place, and that their valor has not eliminated the danger of war for all time. We can see that truth all too vividly today. Even those who returned from war alive and well went on to face the usual difficulties and sad realities of life, including, eventually, death.

The death of Jesus was different. That is the lesson of his Ascension. Where did Christ go when he ascended? The sky? Outer space? No, the planets and stars are part of creation, like the world we inhabit. Pope Benedict XVI pointed out, "Christ's Ascension means that he no longer belongs to the world of corruption and death that conditions our life. It means that he belongs entirely to God. He, the Eternal Son, brought our human existence into God's presence, taking with him [our] flesh and blood..."

The death, resurrection, and ascension of Christ did not remove war from human history, but it did put an end to something more deadly: the separation between God and man. Now that Jesus Christ is seated at the right hand of God, the human race is permanently joined to the life of God. That is the victory of Christ: the establishment of an everlasting peace between God and sinners in need of redemption.
