FROM THE PASTOR

Dear Friends in Christ,

On Trinity Sunday I would like to share some reflections offered last year by Pope Francis:

"The Father is God; the Son is God; the Spirit is God. But they are not three gods: it is one God in three Persons. It is a mystery that Jesus Christ revealed to us: the Holy Trinity... There is the Father to whom I pray in the 'Our Father'; there is the Son, who gave me redemption and justification; there is the Holy Spirit who abides in us and inhabits the Church. And this speaks to our heart because we find it encompassed in that expression of Saint John which summarizes all of Revelation: 'God is love' (1 Jn 4:8-16). The Father is love; the Son is love; the Holy Spirit is love. And inasmuch as he is love, God, while being one alone, is not solitude but communion, among the Father, the Son and the Holy Spirit. Because love is essentially a gift of self, and in its original and infinite reality it is the Father who gives himself by generating his Son, who in turn gives himself to the Father, and their mutual love is the Holy Spirit, the bond of their unity. It is not easy to understand this mystery, but all of us can live it."

Living the mystery of the Trinity is the task of every member of the Church, because every Christian has been baptized in the name of the Triune God, and born again into God's own life. Last Sunday, we celebrated the outpouring of divine life and love on the day of Pentecost. Our new Bishop, Earl Fernandes, spoke on his ordination day of the effects of the first Pentecost, and the need for a new Pentecost in the Church. I urge you to read his words carefully, and let them inspire you: Following Pentecost, the Church grew rapidly. Here in Columbus, we need a new Pentecost to set the world on fire. We also need missionaries and priests willing to make a gift of themselves in the service of the Gospel. While I am honored to be the shepherd of this Diocese and I promise to work hard for you, I bring to your attention that this year in the Diocese of Columbus, there will be more bishops ordained than priests. I ask every man, woman, and child to pray for vocations to the priesthood, especially for our Diocese. St. Jeanne Jugan, the foundress of the Little Sisters of the Poor, once said, "Le plus parfait acte d'amour c'est le sacrifice." The most perfect act of love is sacrifice.

Sacrifice is usually difficult and irksome. Only love can make it easy and perfect love can make it a joy. We are willing to sacrifice in proportion to our love, and when our love is perfect the sacrifice is complete. There is no greater love than this – to lay down one's life for one's friends. I am asking you to make little sacrifices with great love for priestly vocations, and to the young men here present, I am asking you to make a sacrifice – to make a gift of yourself – out of love for the people of our Diocese.

Real Presence, Real Future: For the past two years, the Diocese of Columbus has been working on a strategic planning initiative called *Real Presence, Real Future* in an attempt to anticipate and meet the future needs of the diocese in view of changing demographics, declining church attendance, and an ongoing shortage of priests. At this stage, a set of proposals called draft models have been publicized. These are a first attempt at defining how parishes might be cared for by the clergy: which parishes are clustered together, how many priests are at each parish, etc. You are invited and strongly encouraged to provide feedback on the draft model for our parish. 
