FROM THE PASTOR

Dear Friends in Christ,

Lately we have been working to update and enhance the parish webpage (<u>www.sacredheartschurch.org</u>). We found that it is easy to let things get out of date on a webpage. If you see something on the webpage that is not correct, please contact the parish secretary, who will communicate with the webmaster.

As you all know (I hope), the Diocese of Columbus has been engaged in a process of self-study leading to recommendations about parish structures and staffing. The process is called Real Presence, Real Future. Currently, it is working to finalize recommendations that will go to our new Bishop to aid his decision-making. I have to tell you that input from members of our parish has been pretty limited. In part, I attribute this to the decision of the organizers to ask for online commentary. It's just not convenient for a lot of people to answer online surveys. So, I have prevailed upon the powers that be to have an in-person event at our parish, where everyone can learn about Real Presence, Real Future, and how it might affect our parish in the near future. I can tell you that every single parish in the Diocese of Columbus will be affected by this process, one way or another. Our parish is no different. It is imperative for everyone to understand what is being proposed, and to have a chance to offer their own thoughts while there is still time to do so. Please plan to join us on Tuesday, July 26, after the 6:00 p.m. Mass, in Foeller Hall. There will be a presentation by Fr. Bob Penhallurick, pastor of St. Brendan parish in Hilliard, who has kindly offered to represent the Diocese of Columbus.

To help us out sorting and sizing items, please put the size on the items. If there is a set of sheets, bundle the set together with painters tape and mark them king, queen, etc. It would also be nice to mark bedspreads, table clothes, etc. This will save us many hours of sorting and measuring. As in the past, we will not accept mattresses, large upholstered furniture, microwaves or outdated electronics (no regular TVs and non-laptop computers).

The pancake breakfast is being reviewed until September. The number of breakfasts served has been down to around 30. Since we show up around 6:00 a.m. to get the breakfast items ready to be served at 7:00 a.m. and serve until 10:00 a.m. and then clean up the kitchen and lock up after 11:00 a.m... Well, maybe you see where this is going. The 12 different charities that we have donated to for the last several years may no longer be able to depend on Sacred Hearts Knights of Columbus council for a check. My brother Knights and I will be sad to stop the pancake breakfasts if our number served doesn't get back to over 40 each month. The checks we had been able to give to these groups was usually around \$200.00 or more when breakfasts exceeded 40. I am hopeful that our numbers will pick up quickly so we will see that the fruits of our labor is worth the effort being produced by the Knights of Columbus.

Thank You to all who donate to support our seminarians. As I had previously noted, \$2,000.00 was donated last year. Since April, our new running total is \$284.00 .We'll be continuing to collect after the Masses, and at least one of the collection containers is usually sitting on the table in the narthex. If you have some change or money that you want to donate, feel free to put it in that container.

A new fraternal year began July 1st and runs till June 30th. We have some new members as well as some new officers for this fraternal year.
