FROM THE PASTOR

Dear Friends in Christ,

As this nation celebrates its 246th birthday, it is still trying to absorb the meaning of an event that John Adams, James Madison, Thomas Jefferson, Benjamin Franklin, and George Washington could never have imagined, not even in their craziest dreams: on June 24, 2022, the Supreme Court overturned its 1973 decision that legalized abortion on demand in every state of the country. In fact, the *Roe v. Wade* decision of 1973 was beyond the wildest imagining of the Founding Fathers. Many of those who signed the Declaration of Independence also participated in the constitutional convention of 1787, and they had no idea that the Supreme Court they created would, 190 years later, find in the Constitution a "right to privacy" that would prevent the states from passing laws that would prevent abortions from happening. *Roe v. Wade*, of course, went even further, holding that a fetus is not a person.

It has been instructive to watch the media meltdown that began on June 24 and is likely to keep going for some time. One tweet that got a lot of attention suggested that the founding fathers would be amazed that there were any Catholics on the Supreme Court, implying that the presence of six Catholic justices was responsible for the reversal of *Roe v. Wade*, and also somehow works against the original intent of the Constitution. That's rather ironic, considering that Justice Harry Blackmun, the author of the *Roe v. Wade* decision, was the *only* Catholic on the Supreme Court in 1973.

Independence Day is about liberty, and we will continue to hear many people arguing about "liberty" and "freedom" and "rights" and "democracy" in the days ahead. Listen the meaning that the speakers and writers assign to the words they use, and you will find out what they are really thinking. If someone tells you that "freedom" has been lost because it is now against the law in their state to destroy an innocent unborn child, you know that their definition of "freedom" is distorted. We might also consider Mother Teresa's reflection on the word "poverty": "It is a poverty to decide that a child must die so that you may live as you wish."

Catholics in this country may rightly congratulate themselves for upholding the right of life of the unborn child when hardly anyone else would. In this cause, Catholics took the lead when most non-Catholic Christian denominations either stayed silent or actively took a pro-choice position. Now that something we have prayed for over five decades has finally come to pass, we need to broaden our moral gaze. As our Bishop has reminded us, "a change of law is not the same thing as a change of heart." We continue to affirm that all human life is a gift from God, who is not only the source of life but the Lord of life. The best and most persuasive pro-life witness a Catholic Christian can offer is his or her own life; that is, the example of a life that is really ruled by God. That is the Good News we preach, as summarized in the last line of the Gospel of this Sunday's Mass: "The kingdom of God is at hand for you."

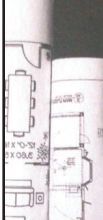
