Dear Friends in Christ,

The pancake breakfast is being reviewed until September. The number of breakfasts served has been down to around 30. Since we show up around 6:00 a.m. to get the breakfast items ready to be served at 7:00 a.m. and serve until 10:00 a.m. and then clean up the kitchen and lock up after 11:00 a.m... Well, maybe you see where this is going. The 12 different charities that we have donated to for the last several years may no longer be able to depend on Sacred Hearts Knights of Columbus council for a check. My brother Knights and I will be sad to stop the pancake breakfasts if our number served doesn't get back to over 40 each month. The checks we had been able to give to these groups was usually around \$200.00 or more when breakfasts exceeded 40. I am hopeful that our numbers will pick up quickly so we will see that the fruits of our labor is worth the effort being produced by the Knights of Columbus. We will know more about this after August 13.

Thank You to all that donate to support our seminarians! As I had previously noted, \$2,000.00 was donated last year. Since April, our running total is was \$284.00. In July, we collected \$161.00, so that brings our running total to \$445.00. We'll be continuing to collect after the Masses. Also, at least one of the collection containers is usually sitting on the table in the narthex. So if you have some change or money that you want to donate, feel free to put it in the container. By the way, our Columbus Diocese received \$68,000.00 for our seminarians!! Of the six dioceses in the state of Ohio, we got the **LARGEST CHECK**! Applause, Applause!!

A new fraternal year has begun as of July 1st. our year runs till June 30th. We have some new members as well as some new officers for this fraternal year. Our meetings will remain the same – the 1st and 4th Wednesdays of each month at 7:00 p.m. Catholic men age 18 and over can be Knights of Columbus. 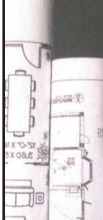
