FROM THE PASTOR

Dear Friends in Christ,

During the past week, I learned more about the Church in two different dioceses in two different countries. On Sunday afternoon, I drove to the Detroit airport to fly to Montreal, where I took part in the ordination ceremony of the new auxiliary bishop, Msgr. Frank Leo. I enjoyed the kind hospitality at the cathedral residence, where I was able to practice speaking French. I think I could learn to speak it well if I had another ten years to practice. While in Montreal I was struck by the sight of the Canadian flag flying at half-mast over the Queen Elizabeth Hotel. I was told that the French-speaking majority in Quebec had great respect for the Queen as a person, but are not in favor of the monarchy.

Returning to Ohio late Tuesday night, I then traveled to Columbus on Wednesday afternoon to take part in a meeting of a group that is working on the reorganization of the presbyteral council of the Diocese of Columbus, at the request of Bishop Fernandes.

On Thursday my attention was focused on more local matters, including reviewing the first meeting of the PSR program at Sacred Hearts parish, and the monthly meeting of the parish pastoral council in Marion.
